It will be a string quartet under the direction of Dr. Lorna Wood - with an absolutely outstanding soloist Nadir Khashimov.

Nadir Khashimov is a prodigy. In 2004 he was Laureate of the International Competition for Young Violinists in Novosibirsk, Russia and won a Prize Awarded by the Audience. He was also Laureate of the Yehudi Menuhin International Competition. In 2002 he won the Kocian International Competition and the G. Enescu International Violin Competition in the Czech Republic. In 2001 he received an Honorable Stipend from the Spivakov Foundation, in 2000 he was voted "Most Likely to Succeed" in the Dvorionas International Competition, and in 1999 he placed first in the regional "Sanyat Guchalar" competition in Uzbekistan and received a stipend award from the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan. He is only 15 years old now!

TOUR TO MONTGOMERY

ITINERARY:

Alabama State Capitol

One of a few state capitols designated a National Historic Landmark, the Alabama State Capitol is where Jefferson Davis took the oath of office as President of the Confederate States of America and where the Selma-to-Montgomery civil rights March ended with Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. delivering a moving speech from the bottom of its steps. The historic Senate and House of Representatives Chambers, the old Supreme Court Chambers and several official offices have all been restored to their Civil War-era and turn-of-the-century appearances.

Montgomery Museum of Fine Arts

A permanent collection that includes examples of 19th and 20th century American paintings and sculpture, Southern regional art, Old Master prints and decorative art. This magnificent building also houses Alabama's first interactive fine arts gallery for children.

Blount Cultural Park

A lush oasis in the city, reminiscent of the English countryside. The park is home to beautiful trees, flowers, sculptures, a wood and stone bridge and the unique architectural designs of the Alabama Shakespeare Festival and the Montgomery Museum of Fine Arts. Free Admission.

Alabama Shakespeare Festival (Overview of the *architecture, landscaping, interior design*)

This internationally acclaimed theatre is one of the ten largest Shakespeare Festivals in the world, presenting world-class contemporary and classic productions and educational programs throughout the entire year. Alabama's Shakespeare Festival is the only American theatre invited to fly the flag of England's Royal Shakespeare Company.
